

CYSTOURETHROSCOPY POST-OPERATIVE INSTRUCTIONS

After surgery, what should I expect?

No stitches or sutures are used in this surgery and there will be no dressing to worry about. In some cases you may awake from surgery with a catheter in place.

• Pink-red urine, burning with urination, and frequency of urination is not uncommon following this procedure but should not last longer than 48 hours.

Diet and Activity Following Surgery

- Your diet can return to normal immediately following the procedure. We do recommend limiting caffeine, alcohol and spicy food, and to increase your fluid intake to help minimize bladder irritability.
- Abdominal Distention, Constipation, or Bloating: Take a stool softener as directed. If you still have no movement after 24 hours, it is safe to take a Ducolax suppository.
- It is safe to walk and return to work the day following the procedure.
- You may shower as soon as your body will tolerate it.

Post-procedure, if you experience any of the following, please contact our office:

- Fever over 101° F, uncontrolled pain, nausea, or vomiting.
- Inability to urinate.
- Increased blood or blood clots in the urine.
- Increased pain.
- 24 hours after your procedure: Burning or pain with urination, frequency.
